Our Money and Our (Inner) Life: What Does Money Really Mean, to Us and to our Group Members?

This workshop explores how early lessons and unconscious emotional agendas inform the meanings we give to having, using and losing money. Our fears, dreams and fantasies--about success and failure, self-worth and shame, safety and risk, plenty and deprivation--may sabotage realistic thinking, encourage denial, and intensify anxiety and disappointment. Exploring these underlying meanings can help ourselves and our group members to weather difficult times.

Learning Objectives:

Participants will: 1) identify their own 'early lessons' in the practical and emotional meanings of money; 2) identify their own styles and emotional meanings in their adult relationships to money; 3) learn tools for exploring their clients' styles and underlying fears/fantasies/feelings about money; 4) be able to describe how money functions as a symbol and a language in the emotional lives of diverse group members.
